#### Introduction

The ACP-EC Partnership Agreement signed in Cotonou on 23 June 2000 (and revised in Luxembourg on 25 June 2005) brings together 79 African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) States and the 28 Member States of the European Union, with the common objective of reducing and eventually eradicating poverty in a way consistent with sustainable development and gradual integration of the ACP countries into the world economy.

The **intra-ACP Strategy and Multiannual Indicative programme 2008-2013**, has identified three clusters of actions to be financed under the 10<sup>th</sup> EDF, the second of which include measures aiming at integrating the ACP States both among themselves and in the world economy by means of investments in higher education, science and research, among others.

This conference gathers together beneficiaries of three ACP-EU co-operation programmes financed under the 10<sup>th</sup> EDF: **EDULINK II**, the **ACP-Science & Technology Programme (S&T II)** and the **ACP Caribbean & Pacific Research Programme for Sustainable Development**. The grant beneficiaries of these programmes are sometimes the same universities or university networks in ACP and EU countries. In addition, the beneficiaries of the latter two programmes also include other public, academic, private and civil sector organizations.

The objective of the conference is to foster networking and co-operation among grant beneficiaries of the three programmes. Participants will establish contacts, share experiences, discuss plans and future collaborations, and gain knowledge on appropriately managing their projects.

#### **EDULINK II**

The EDULINK programme has recently started a second phase. The 2012 Call for Proposals has awarded 47 grant projects, for a total financing of € 23.3 M sourced from both the European Development Fund and the EU Budget (co-operation with South Africa).

EDULINK's overall objective is to foster capacity building and regional integration in the field of higher education through institutional networking. The current phase II of EDULINK is designed to continue and enhance the achievements realized under the previous phase, targeting improvements in the effectiveness, management, and visibility of ACP Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) as well as promoting innovation and ensuring their competitiveness in the global environment.

EDULINK II focuses on two priority thematic areas, 'Energy access and efficiency' and 'Agriculture and food security', which have been identified as part of the development aid policy between the European Union and the ACP Group of States.

#### **ACP Science & Technology Programme (S&T II)**

The ACP S&T Programme has also started a second phase. The 2012 Call for Proposals has awarded 21 grant projects, for a total financing of € 20.8 M sourced from both the European Development Fund and the EU Budget (co-operation with South Africa).

The objectives of ACP S&T II are to address the scientific and technological divide between ACP member states and the most industrialised countries; to strengthen Science, Technology and Innovation (STI) in ACP countries to enable creation, update and use of scientific knowledge; and to enhance the use of STI as a key enabler for poverty reduction, growth and socio-economic development. The Programme is convinced that one of the requirements for an effective fight against poverty in the ACP countries is the application of knowledge gained from Science and Technology in order to promote innovation and ultimately develop appropriate technologies, which could be effectively deployed within the context of local needs and resources.

S&T II focuses also on the two priority thematic areas, 'Energy access and efficiency' and 'Agriculture and food security'.

#### ACP Caribbean & Pacific Research Programme for Sustainable Development

The 2010 Call for Proposals has awarded 10 grant projects, for a total financing of € 4.8 M sourced from the European Development Fund.

The Programme is complementary to other ACP and/or EU initiatives such as the EDULINK and ACP S&T programmes and the FP7 Framework Programme for Research. For sustainable development, the inclusion of Science and Technology is imperative not only for Caribbean and Pacific (C&P) countries to become more resilient to adverse impacts of climate change, but also to become self-sufficient and to meet the Millennium Development Goals, in particular the 'eradication of extreme poverty and hunger'.

The objective of this Programme is to contribute to sustainable development of C&P countries belonging to the ACP Group of States through research in science and technologies by supporting research projects in the fields of 'Post-harvest and Agriculture', 'Renewable and Sustainable Energy', 'Water & Sanitation' and 'Climate Change'.
